

1. Jesus bears the Spirit

John 1:32-33

And John bore witness: "I saw the Spirit <u>descend</u> from heaven like a dove, and it <u>remained</u> on him. ³³ I myself did not know him, but he who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on whom you see the Spirit <u>descend</u> and <u>remain</u>, this is he who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.'

The Spirit's Work in the Life of Jesus

Incarnation	"the Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you" (Luke 1:35)
Baptism	"And when Jesus was baptized, immediately he went up from the water, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming to rest on him" (Matt. 3:16)
Temptation	Led by the Spirit into wilderness to be tested, returns in power of the Spirit (Luke 4:1,14)
Ministry	"God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him"

Resurrection

1 John 4:1-3

Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, for many false prophets have gone out into the world. ² By this you know the Spirit of God: every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God, ³ and every spirit that does not confess Jesus is not from God.

John 16:13-15

When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. 14 He will glorify me, for he will take what is mine and declare it to you. 15 All that the Father has is mine; therefore I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you.

John 20:19-22




Application

What is the essence, heart, and core of the Spirit's work today? ... Is there a single divine strategy that unites all [facets] of his life-giving action as a means to one end? I think there is...the Spirit makes known the personal presence...of the risen, reigning Savior [in such a way that] three things keep happening.

3. Jesus gives the Spirit

How do we receive this gift?
