



Romans 8:28-39


Romans 8:28-39




1. APPLYING THE GOSPEL TO FEAR

2. APPLYING THE GOSPEL TO GUILT


When you feel condemned by the disapproval of your peers or the accusations of your conscience, remember that there is no condemnation for those who are in Christ.



Romans 8:35-37

Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword?

36 As it is written, "For your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered." ³⁷ No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us.
