- 1) Confidence to enter... (vv. 19-20)
- 2) A great high priest... (v. 21)

#### Three exhortations: *"Let us..."*

- 1) Draw near (v. 22)
- 2) Hold fast (v. 23)
- 3) Consider one another (vv. 24-25)

#### Three motivations: *"For..."*

- 1) A warning: *"the Lord will judge..."* (vv. 26-31)
- 2) An encouragement: *"recall the former days..."* (vv. 32-34)
- 3) A challenge: *"therefore, do not throw away your confidence..."*  
(vv. 35-39)

The writer of Hebrews directs us to the doctrine of indwelling sin. On the cross and in the resurrection, Christ broke the power of sin over us (Rom. 6:1-14), but the presence of sin remains. Sin is being eradicated within us, and this process will continue until we are sin-free. But while sin remains, we must remember that sin is deceitful. Sin blinds —and guess who gets blinded first? Me!...Christ captures this truth with his word picture in Matthew 7. He says we can see a speck of dust in our neighbor's eye, but we are oblivious to a huge piece of lumber sticking out of our own! Since each of us still has sin remaining in us, we will have pockets of spiritual blindness.
